ORDINANCE 2011-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER ESTABLISHING FEES FOR MATERIALS CONTAINMENT AND CLEAN UP

Mayor Cope read Ordinance 2011-01 upon second reading. The motion to approve Ordinance 2011-01 and to open for public hearing was made by Commissioner Bethea, seconded by Commissioner Smith. Comments: Some further clarification was requested and provided. Being no further comments by the public the motion to close the public hearing was made by Commissioner Bethea, seconded by Commissioner Smith. The motion to adopt Ordinance 2011-01 was made by Commissioner Bethea, seconded by Commissioner Smith. Votes: Cope-Yes, Bethea-Yes, Smith-Yes. All in favor and Ordinance 2011-01 was hereby adopted. *ORDINANCE No. 2011-01*

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER ESTABLISHING FEES FOR MATERIALS CONTAINMENT AND CLEAN UP

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Township Commissioners of the Township of Bass River as follows: 1. That there be added to the code of the Township of Bass River a section in the fee Ordinance entitled "Schedule of Miscellaneous Fees" providing the following:

Materials Containment/ Clean up fees:

Any hazardous or other materials containment cleanup costs, property damage, and/or other costs incurred by the Township of Bass River or it's employees or organized volunteers in the course of their employment or volunteered duties, as a result of an incident, accident, spill, leakage, seepage, unintentional or intentional act upon any lands, waters or properties within the Township of Bass River, which were incurred or deemed necessary by the Township or it's duly authorized employees or volunteers to cause the containment and/or clean up of materials, hazardous or otherwise, to protect the health, welfare and safety of the inhabitants and their property or belongings, shall be the responsibility of the person, persons, or entity causing the incident that required said containment and/or clean up actions and costs.

The costs to be reimbursed as a result of such containment and/or clean up actions shall be the actual costs incurred by the Township and/or its volunteer organizations plus administrative costs as calculated and determined by the Township of Bass River. Any such reimbursement shall be in addition to any costs to be reimbursed to other agencies of the Federal, State, County and/or Local Government having jurisdiction including but not limited to any fines, penalties or special assessments as a result of any enforcement actions at any level of government.

Nothing herein shall be construed to require the Township of Bass River to be responsible for the containment or cleanup of hazardous or nonhazardous materials identified on any lands or waters therein.

ORDINANCE 2011-02

ORDINANCE 2011-02 CALENDAR YEAR 2011 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

Mayor Cope read Ordinance 2011-02 upon second reading. The motion to approve Ordinance 2011-02 and to open for public hearing was made by Commissioner Bethea, seconded by Commissioner Smith. Comments: Mr. Assur asked for some clarification and if this would increase taxes. Commissioner Bethea provided clarification and states that it would increase appropriations not taxes. Mr. Aaronson asked about the 3.5%. Comm. Bethea told him it was a formula which is provided by the State of NJ. Being no further comments by the public the motion to close the public hearing was made by Commissioner Bethea, seconded by Commissioner Smith. The motion to adopt Ordinance 2011-02 was made by Commissioner Bethea, seconded by Commissioner Smith. Votes: Cope-Yes, Bethea-Yes, Smith-Yes. All in favor and Ordinance 2011-02 was hereby adopted.

ORDINANCE 2011-02 CALENDAR YEAR 2011 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Bass River in the County of Burlington finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2011 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners hereby determines that a 1.5 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$ 14,997.02 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Bass River, in the County of Burlington, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2011 budget year, the final

appropriations of the Township of Bass River shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$ 34,993.04, and that the CY 2011 municipal budget for the Township of Bass River be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

ORDINANCE 2011-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 15.04 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE ENTITLED "STATE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE"

Mayor Cope introduced Ordinance 2011-03 on first reading by title only. The motion to approve Ordinance 2011-03 by title only was made by Commissioner Bethea, seconded by Commissioner Smith. Votes: Cope-Yes, Bethea-Yes, Smith-Yes. All in favor and Ordinance 2011-03 was approved on first reading by title only with second reading and public hearing scheduled for April regular meeting.

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING TITLE 15, CHAPTER 15.04 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE ENTITLED "STATE UNIFORM CONSTRUCTION CODE"

BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body, by the Bass River Township Board of Commissioners that the Township Code of Bass River Township is hereby amended and supplemented so as to repeal in its entirety Chapter 15.04 entitled "State Uniform Construction Code" and replace it with the following:

SECTION 1.

Section 15.04 Construction Code Fees

15.04.010 The following fee schedule is hereby adopted and established for the

following construction and subcode fees:

(1) Building sub code fees.

(a) New construction. Fees for new construction shall be based upon the volume of structure. Volume shall be computed in accordance with <u>NJ.A.C.</u> 5:23-2.28. Use groups and types of construction are as classified and defined in Articles 3 and 4 of the building sub code.

- [1] New residential construction.
 - [a] Per cubic foot of volume: \$0.030.

[2] Other Use Groups

[a] Use Groups A-I, A-2, A-3, A-4, F-l, F-2, S-1 and S-2: \$0.020

[b] Structures on farms, including commercial farm buildings under <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:23-3.2(d): \$0.0008.

[c] Maximum fee: \$1,145.00

[d] Minimum fee: \$60.

(b) Renovations, alterations, repairs, and site construction associated with the premanufactured construction. Fee based on estimated cost of the work. To determine estimated cost, the applicant shall submit to the Construction Official such cost data as may be available produced by the homeowner, the architect or engineer of record, or by a recognized estimating firm, or by the contractor. A bona fide contractor's bid, if available, shall be submitted. The Construction Official shall make the final decision regarding estimated cost.

Over \$100,000	Add \$18 per \$1,000
Minimum fee	\$60

(c) Additions. Fees shall be computed on the same basis as for new construction for the added portion.

(d) Combination renovations and additions. Fees shall be computed separately in accordance with \$\$ 159-4A(1)(a) and 159-4A(1)(b).

(e) Temporary structures. The fee for temporary structures, towers, fences greater than six feet in height, open decks not attached to a principal or accessory structure and similar structures for which volume cannot be computed shall be \$60.

(f) Pools

- [1] Aboveground: \$75.
- [2] In-ground: \$150.
- [3] Commercial: \$250.

(g) Bulkheads, docks, wharves and piers. The fees shall be computed as an alteration.

(h) The fee for roofing or siding in R-3 and R-4 uses shall be \$60.

(2) Plumbing subcode fees.

(a) Fixtures and appliances. The fee per fixture for fixtures and appliances shall be \$15.00, except as provided for in \$ 159-4A(2)(b).

(b) Special devices. The fee per device for grease traps, oil separators, water-cooled air-conditioning units, refrigeration units, utility service connections, backflow preventers, steam boilers, hot-water boilers (excluding those for domestic water heating), gas piping, gas service entrances, active solar systems, sewer pumps, interceptors and fuel oil piping shall be \$75.

(c) Minimum fee: \$60.

(3) Fire protection sub code fees.

(a) The fee for sprinklers, standpipes, detectors (smoke and heat), pre-engineered suppression systems, gas- and oilfired appliances not connected to the plumbing system, kitchen exhaust systems, incinerators and crematoriums shall be as follows:

[1] One to 20 heads: \$75.

[2] Twenty-one to 100 heads: \$130.

[3] One hundred one to 200 heads: \$230.

[4] Two hundred one to 400 heads: \$594.

[5] Four hundred one to 1,000 heads: \$822

[6] Over 1,000 heads: \$1,050.

- (b) One to 12 detectors, \$60; m addition, for each 25 detectors, \$15.
- (c) Standpipe, each: \$229.
- (d) Independent pre-engineered systems: \$92.
- (e) Gas- or oil-fired appliance not connected to the plumbing system, each: \$60.
- (f) Commercial kitchen exhaust system, each: \$100.
- (g) Incinerator, each: \$365.
- (h) Crematorium, each: \$365.
- (i) Minimum fee: \$60.
- (4) Electrical subcode fees.

(a) Fixtures or receptacles. The fee for receptacles and fixtures which shall include lighting outlets, wall switches, electric discharge fixtures, convenience receptacle or similar fixture, and motors or devices of less than one horsepower or one kilowatt, burglar, fire and communication devices, etc., shall be as follows:

[1] One to 25: \$60.

[2]For each 25 additional: add \$25.

- (b) Motors or electrical devices, each:
 - [1] Greater than one horsepower or kilowatt to 10 horsepower or kilowatts: \$25.
 - [2] Greater than 10 horsepower or kilowatts to 50 horsepower or kilowatts: \$50.
 - [3] Greater than 50 horsepower or kilowatts to 100
 - [4] Greater than 100 horsepower: \$500

- (c) Transformers and generators, each:
 - [1] Greater than one kilowatt to 10 kilowatts: \$25.
 - [2] Greater than 10 kilowatts to 45 kilowatts: \$50.
 - [3] Greater than 45 kilowatts to 112.5 kilowatts: \$200.
 - [4] Greater than 112.5 kilowatts: \$500.
- (d) Service panels, service entrance or subpanel, each:
 - [1] One ampere to 225 amperes: \$75.
 - [2] Greater than 225 amperes to 400 amperes: \$150.
 - [3] Greater than 400 amperes to 1,000 amperes: \$250.
 - [4] Greater than 1,000 amperes: \$500.

(e) Private swimming pool, spa, hot tub or fountain. Annual fees for inspection of public swimming pools, spa, hot tub or fountain shall be \$60.

The fee for initial inspection of a new public swimming pool, spa, hot tub or fountain: \$100.

(f) Signs: \$60.

(g) Installation of single and multiple station smoke or heat detectors and fire, burglar or security alarm systems in anyone or two family dwelling: \$60.

(h) Photovoltaic Systems

[1] Systems up to 10 kw: \$250 flat fee.

[2] Systems greater than 10 kw shall be assessed a fee of \$250 plus \$25 per each additional kilowatt.

(i) Irrigation Systems: \$60.00

[1] For the purpose of computing these fees, all motors, except those in plug-in appliances, shall be counted, including control equipment, generators, transformers and all hearing, cooking or other devices consuming or generating electrical current.

[1] (k) Minimum fee: \$60.

(5) Fees applicable to \$\$ 159-4A(l) through 159-4A(4) above.

(a) Plan review fee. 20% of the amount to be charged for a new construction permit.

(b) Basic construction fee. The sum of the parts computed on the basis of the volume or cost of construction, the number of plumbing fixtures and equipment, the number of electrical fixtures and devices and the number of sprinklers, standpipes and detectors (smoke and heat) at the unit rates provided herein, plus any special fees.

(c) Certificates and other permits.

[1] Demolition or removal permit.

[a] Structures less than 5,000 square feet in area and less than 30 feet in height (Use Group R-3), and for structures on farms, including commercial farm buildings under N.IA.C.5:23-3.2(d): \$75.

[b] Fuel tanks: \$75.

[c] All other use groups: \$100.

[2] Sign permit. Permit fee to construct a sign shall be in the amount of \$1 per square foot surface area of the sign, computed on one side only for double-faced signs. Minimum fee: \$60.

[3] Certificate of occupancy: \$30.

[4] Certificate of occupancy granted pursuant to a change of use group: \$125.

- [a] \$50. to building.
- [b] \$25. to plumbing.

[c] \$25 to fire.

[d] \$25. to electrical.

[5] Certificate of Occupancy: \$200

[a] \$80 to building.

[b] \$40 to plumbing.

[c] \$40 to fire.

- [d] \$40 to electrical
- [6] Annual permits.

[a] Construction permit. The fee for a construction permit shall be a flat fee based upon the number of maintenance workers who are employed by the facility, and who are primarily engaged in work that is governed by a subcode. Managers, engineers and clericals shall not be considered maintenance workers for the purpose of establishing the annual construction permit fee.

[b] Annual permits may be issued for building, fire protection, electrical and plumbing.

[i] One to 25 workers (including foreman), each: \$667.

[ii] Each additional worker over 25: \$150.

[iii] Prior to the issuance of an annual permit, a training registration fee of \$140 per sub code shall be submitted by the applicant. Checks shall be made payable to "Treasurer, State of New Jersey."

[7] Reinstatement of lapsed permit: \$60 per subcode.

[8] Elevator devices, where applicable, shall be in accordance with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:23-12.6

[9] Cross connections and backflow preventers that are subject to testing and require re-inspection, each: \$60.

[10] Relocation of structures permit: The following fees shall be assessed for relocation of building and structures to a new location, including pre-manufactured:

\$50,001 to \$100,000	Add \$20 per \$1,000
Over \$100,000	Add \$18 per \$1,000
Minimum fee	\$60

A schedule of the instruction and sub code fees established by this chapter shall be posted in the office of the Construction Official and shall be made available to the public. Any fees not mentioned in the above fee schedule shall be the same as the fees assessed by the State of New Jersey as delineated within <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:23-4.20 or applicable regulation.

SECTION 2. After introduction of this ordinance, the Township Clerk shall send a copy of this ordinance to the Township Planning Board for its review and comment. The Township shall send a copy of the ordinance to the Burlington County Planning Board pursuant to <u>NJ.S.A.</u> 40:55D-16.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law and the filing of the adopted ordinance with the Burlington County Planning Board.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.
