§ 1. NO PASSING ZONE

A No Passing Zone is hereby established and shall be maintained along the entire length of South Maple Avenue in the Township of Bass River, County of Burlington

§ 2. Penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided for by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of this chapter shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$400.00.

WHEREAS, the Townships are authorized by the "Shared Services Act", N.J.S.A. 40A:65-4, et seq. to enter into any contract for the joint provision of any service which any party to the agreement is authorized to render within its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to participate in the Shared Services Agreement between the Townships and enter into the agreement establishing the respective rights and obligations of the parties regarding this Shared Services Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township of Bass River that:

- 1. The attached Shared Services Agreement between Bass River Township and the Borough of Tuckerton shall be effective according to its terms.
- 2. The Mayor and Township Clerk of Bass River Township are hereby authorized to sign, seal, execute and witness/attest the Agreement.
- 3. The Mayor and Township Clerk are authorized to take any action necessary to implement the terms of the Shared Services Agreement.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

The meeting was open for public comment at 8:10 p.m. upon a motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Bethea.

Mr. W. Aaronson asked if Engineer fees seemed high this month. Deputy Mayor Bethea explained the Engineer has done a lot of grant work in town and monitoring well reports.

Mrs. R. Bourguignon commented on West Road and feels that West Road was dropped down when repaying was done. Commissioner Smith said the project is not yet complete. After first raid it will be further determined what work needs to be done.

Mr. W. Aaronson asked if millings where taken to the dump from the West Road project. Commissioner Smith stated that, no, only dirt from the sides of the road where brought to the dump and utilized and any brush taken was a small amount. He noted that the brush that was trimmed was brush that would have been trimmed by the township anyway. Solicitor noted that the project was bid appropriately.

Mr. L. Bourguignon commented on accidents on the parkway and the need for information to be relayed to central to relay back to emergency services so that they have the most up to date information on the site.

Mr. W. Aaronson asked about the outstanding issues sited by the fire marshal against cramers junkyard. This information was at this time confidential.

Mr. H. Bourguignon noted that the tax maps need to be corrected. Mayor Cope told him that this is a process that will continue.

Mrs. R. Bourguignon asked why New Gretna is not utilized when using GPS...Only Bass River Township.

Mrs. Dolch told the Board that a group inspected the generator at the school. The generator is damaged beyond repair. Also, commented on a gate being open to the generator as well as doors to the kitchen and noted concern for safety of the children. This should be voiced to the administration of the school.

Being no further comments the motion to close the public portion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Bethea. All in favor and public comment was closed at 8:50 p.m.

Being no further business to come before the Board the motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Bethea. All in favor and meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.
