PUBLIC COMMENT:

The meeting was open for public comment at 7:28 p.m. upon a motion by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione. All present in favor.

J. Capriglione of the New Gretna Volunteer Fire Company gave a report on the state of the equipment of the fire company. They will need to replace an engine within the next 3 years. The unit is 21 years old now and over the standard. Options are out there but finding the money and doing it is the challenge. Deputy Mayor Capriglione wanted to know what the basis of the standard is that is set for trucks and who sets the standards that a truck that is 20 years old is not capable to run calls. The hours, the mileage and the repairs need to be considered when writing a grant. He would request this information come before the board to help make a determination.

C. Bitzberger said that at the last meeting it was brought up about property taxes and noting the Viking has not had a property tax increase since 2006. Permits were issued for the energy building and another building. It was brought up that the tax assessor has not added the assessment yet. Mayor stated the Tax Assessor would go out once the permits go out and a CO is issued. Ms. Bitzberger asked why someone didn't go out after the energy building was complete. Mayor said that is something was missed then he would pull the file and go and inspect and place an added assessment on the tax bill and he could go back to previous years with the added as far as he can. Ms. Bitzberger remains concerned over the possibility of future tax increases. Mayor suggested she set up an appointment with the assessor and request to see the most recent added assessments.

Being no further comments, the motion to close the public portion was made by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione. All in favor and public portion was closed at 7:53 p.m.

Being no further business to come before the Board the motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione. All in favor and meeting was adjourned at 7:53 p.m.
