## **TONNAGE GRANT APPLICATION RESOLUTION 2016-30**

Comments: Township Auditor, Kevin Frenia, said the budget is stable and eligible for self exam this year. C. Bitzberger noted that she thought the town would receive some additional monies from Viking. She also feels that salaries for employees are too low and minimum should be \$15.00/hour. W. Aaronson asked for an explanation for the concern over surplus. Mr. Frenia explained because we don't have a lot of added revenue sources and due to the 2% cap our fund balance needs to be maintained and paid close attention to. We must remain careful about our spending. Mr. Aaronson noted that his tax bill went up and requested further explanation. Mr. Frenia said that the Township Tax—the local portion is just a small portion of the tax bill. School taxes and county taxes also need to come into the picture when looking at the tax bill. Mr. Aaronson asked if Mr. Frenia sees any movement on Pilot Funds and placing the Township back to the 100% funding category. Mr. Frenia said no he does not see that happening.

Being no further comments on the budget the motion to close the public hearing was made by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione. Votes: Cope-Yes, Bourguignon-Yes, Capriglione. All in favor.

He said that it should be clear that the value of the Viking increase because of the increase of the property was based on what the Mayor has stated at a previous meeting. He is still pushing for a total reassessment of the entire plant.
- R. Adams commented on issue with the Fire Company. Mr. Adams was to receive a letter in the mail from the fire company. Mr. Adams stated that in a past meeting he made comments referring to the fire company and letting the township commissioners know that if we were passing an ordinance authorizing the fire company 3<sup>rd</sup> party billing that all paperwork in the fire company should be in order before proceeding.
- C. Bitzberger noted a letter was sent to the Commissioners from the Citizens Action Committee and requested comment on it. Mayor said this matter was being discussed further in Executive Session.
