ORDINANCE 2016-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER AMENDING CHAPTER 8.04 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF BASS RIVER TOWNSHIP

Mayor Cope read Ordinance 2016 by title. The motion was made by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione to approve Ordinance 2016-02 upon first reading by title only with second reading and public hearing scheduled for October regular meeting. Votes: Cope—Yes, Capriglione-Yes, Bourguignon-Yes. All in favor and Ordinance 2016-02 was hereby approved upon first reading by title.

TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER Ordinance 2016-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER AMENDING CHAPTER 8.04 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF BASS RIVER TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Bass River Township Board of Commissioners finds that there is a need to modify the Bass River Township Code provisions as they currently exist under Chapter 8.04 of the revised Township Ordinances which are applicable to Campgrounds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Bass River Township Board of Commissioners that Bass River Township Code Section 8.04.040 I "Campground Code" be and is hereby replaced with the

following:

I. Any mobile home, as defined in the Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Bass River and amendments and supplements thereto, which has heretofore been located in a licensed trailer park pursuant to the terms of a prior ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for the Regulation and Licensing of Trailers and Trailer Camps within the Township of Bass River, County of Burlington and State of New Jersey" and amendments and supplements thereto and any mobile home park as defined in the Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Bass River and amendments and supplements thereto which may previously have been licensed under either or both of the above-mentioned ordinances, be and are hereby declared to be nonconforming uses by virtue of the Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Bass River and amendments and supplements thereto. Any such nonconforming mobile home park which may exist in the Township of Bass River is expressly subject to the provisions of this ordinance where applicable including the fee requirements in Section XI hereinabove set forth. Only one annual operating permit fee per year shall be required under the terms of this ordinance for any one campground or nonconforming mobile home park if one may exist or any combination thereof. However, in the event that a nonconforming mobile home occupies a site in any campground, nonconforming mobile home park, or combination thereof, all of which are regulated by the terms of the within ordinance, the operator of such campground, nonconforming mobile home park, or combination thereof shall pay to the

Township a monthly fee in the amount of twenty one (\$21.00) dollars for each such nonconforming mobile home occupying a site in such campground, nonconforming mobile home Park, or combination thereof for each month or part thereof as said space is occupied.

In addition, the operator shall file a statement under oath of the first of each month with the Township Clerk stating the number of such sites occupied during the previous month.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all other provisions of the Township Code currently in effect, are hereby saved from repeal, and shall remain in full force and effect;

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that if any provision of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision or clause of this ordinance shall be judged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such order of judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect upon proper passage and in accordance with the law.

The motion was made by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione to approve Resolution 2016-61. Votes: Cope—Yes, Capriglione-Yes, Bourguignon-Yes. All in favor and Resolution 2016-61 was hereby approved.

RESOLUTION NO. 2015-61

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER
TO EXTEND THE SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH
THE BOROUGH OF TUCKERTON FOR THE SHARED USE OF PUBLIC WORKS EQUIPMENT
PURSUANT TO THE INTERLOCAL SERVICES ACT N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1 et. seq.

WHEREAS, the Bass River Township Board of Commissioners recognizes the need to provide the residents of the Township with appropriate cost savings measures and the need to take advantage of opportunities to provide cost savings in the administration of local government services for the benefit of all residents; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., any municipality of the State may enter into a contract with any other municipality for the joint provision of any service that any party to the agreement is empowered to render within its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Bass River and the Borough of Tuckerton have previously entered into a Shared Services Agreement that covers the shared use of public works equipment dated October 3, 2011. That agreement will expire and both the Township and the Borough wish to continue the prior relationship for shared services by entering into the new lease extension for the shared use of public works equipment; and

WHEREAS, The Township of Bass River and Borough of Tuckerton have negotiated the terms and conditions of an agreement for the provision of such services as detailed in the attached Shared Services Agreement and lease extension; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Bass River evidences its desire to enter into such Agreement through passage of this resolution; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to participate in the Shared Services Agreement between the Township and the Borough and enter into the agreement establishing the respective rights and obligations of the parties regarding this Shared Services Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township of Bass River Board of Commissioners that:

- 1. The attached Shared Services Agreement and lease extension between the Township of Bass River and the Borough of Tuckerton shall be effective according to its terms.
- 2. The Mayor of the Township of Bass River is hereby authorized to sign, seal, execute and witness/attest the Agreement.
- 3. The Mayor and Township Clerk are authorized to take any action necessary to implement the terms of the Shared Services Agreement.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

The meeting was open for public comment at 8:38 p.m. upon a motion by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione. All present in favor.

L. Assur commented on the State not paying property taxes for the property that it owns. The State does not pay for maintenance and upkeep of the properties. He asked if there was a way the Township could get them to pay their fair share. Mr. Aaronson said the PILOT funds are meant to pay the Township for this. However, the State has not increases these funds and the Township should band with other towns to sue the state.

W. Aaronson asked about the process of selling property located on the other side of Offshore Manor which the Township owns. Mayor said the process is continuing and a sale will be forthcoming.

T. Williams commended the Commissioners for trying to move these properties back onto the tax rolls.

Be no further comments, the motion to close the public portion was made by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Mayor Cope. All present in favor and public portion was closed at 9:19 p.m.

Being no further business to come before the Board the motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Mayor Cope. All present in favor and meeting was adjourned at 9:20 p.m.
