Votes: Cope-Yes, Capriglione-Yes, Bourguignon-Yes and meeting was open for Public hearing on the 2020 Municipal Budget. Comments and Questions heard: Mrs. Marion Assur asked if the Township pays down the debt will we acquire debt later. Mr. Frenia said that if the Town stays at rate once debt is paid there he feels that the Town will not have any other big increase in the foreseeable future—that is for Local Purpose tax. Mr. Leo Assur asked if that means that the town will have more surplus next year. Mr. Frenia said he hope it will. Mr. William Aaronson commented that it may not be a bad thing for the State of NJ to come in and run the Town. Ms. Diane Develin asked if the Town needs approval for this increase from the State. Mr. Frenia said yes and the State had given its approval. Mr. Carl Swanseen commented that the increase is big and asked for more clarification. Mr. Frenia provided more information. Mr. Digiaccomo noted that foreclosures on Route 9 have increased and this will continue. Tracy Digiaccomo said that property value will degrease and asked if that was being factored in. CFO Al Stanley said yes those calculations are looked at every year. Mr. Tom Williams asked if the Township has increased reserve for uncollected taxes to anticipate more foreclosures. CFO noted the 95% collection was anticipated and 96% was collected in 2018. Mr. Carl Swanseen asked how the Township compares to other communities. Mr. Frenia said he doesn't have those exact figures. Being no further comments the motion to close the public hearing on the 2020 municipal budget was made by Commissioner Bourguignon, seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione. All in favor and the public hearing was hereby closed.

The motion to approve the Resolution 2019-40 to amend the 2020 Municipal Budget and open the meeting for public hearing on budget amendment was made by Commissioner Bourguignon and seconded by Deputy Mayor Capriglione. Votes: Cope-Yes, Capriglione-Yes. Meeting was open for public comment on the amendment. Mr. Ben Adams asked if the State had problems with the park grants. Mr. Frenia explained the State is requesting some line items be moved to other line items in the budget. The amounts are not changing. The Park Grants have nothing to do with it. Mr. William Aaronson asked if parks make retables easier to obtain. Mr. Frenia said that yes it makes the Town more appealing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, it is anticipated that the deliberation conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Governing Body that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality and if not then legally privileged.
