Awarding Contract for the Amasa Landing Road Boat Ramp Phase II Project in the Township of Bass River, Burlington County, New Jersey

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Bass River have received sealed proposals for the furnishing and installation of a concrete cable boat ramp for the Amasa Landing Road Boat Ramp project in the Township of Bass River, Burlington County, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4 states that a contract, the cost of which would exceed \$17,500.00 in a fiscal year, shall be awarded only after public advertising for bids and bidding therefore; and

WHEREAS, there has been public advertisement for bids and the Township Clerk has received and opened bids on February 27, 2019 for the purpose of awarding a contract for the aforementioned boat ramp installation at Amasa Landing Road; and

WHEREAS, the Township's engineer and Township solicitor have reviewed the bids and determined the three (3) lowest bids to be in conformance with the bid specifications and has advised that a certain entity is the lowest qualified responsible bidder for said contract and has recommended that the Municipality award said contract or reject the bids within sixty (60) days as required by N.J.S.A. 10A: 11-4; and

WHEREAS, the Township's Chief Financial Officer has certified that there are sufficient funds available for the purpose of awarding a contract to said entity and his certification being attached hereto and made a part hereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Bass River, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. That the Chief Financial Officer has declared that there are sufficient funds available for the aforesaid purpose, and that the Board of Commissioners hereby directs that the hereinafter expenditure be charged against such funds.
- 2. That the Board of Commissioners, for the aforementioned reasons, hereby declares that Ramson, Inc. d/b/a ATLANTIC MARINE CONSTRUCTION, located at P.O. Box 924, Cape May Court House, NJ is the lowest qualified bidder for the aforementioned contract and hereby awards a contract to Ramson d/b/a Atlantic Marine Construction for the aforesaid purpose in the amount of Ninety One Thousand Five Hundred (\$91,500.00) Dollars in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Bid Proposal, the Notice to Bidders and Specifications, copies of which are on file in the Office of the Township Clerk and available for public inspection during regular business hours.

- 3. That the award to Ramson, Inc., d/b/a Atlantic Marine Construction, is consistent with the legal requirements of the lowest responsible bidder, which conforms, to all specification requirements and applicable statutory provisions.
- 4. That the Board of Commissioners hereby directs the Township Clerk to return the bid securities to the unsuccessful bidders in accordance with NJSA 40A: 11-4.
- 5. That the Board of Commissioners does hereby direct the Township Mayor and Clerk to execute any contract documents which are necessary to effectuate the terms of this Resolution which shall be prepared by or reviewed by the Office of the Township Attorney.

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO PROPOSED STATE ACTION TO CLEARCUT TREES AT THE FIRE TOWER LOCATED ON EAST GREENBUSH ROAD IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BASS RIVER

WHEREAS, the Township of Bass River Board of Commissioners has been notified by the State of New Jersey Forest Fire Service (NJFFS) that the State Department of Environmental protection will be resubmitting the application to the Pinelands Commission for the proposed clear-cutting of more than sixteen (16) acres of trees located at and near the fire tower on East Greenbush Road (known as clear cutting); and

WHEREAS, there are alternatives available to clear cutting the trees, by way of newer technology such as digital cameras, global positioning systems and drones; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners finds that this State action could result in significant administrative and undue safety burdens on the Township; and

WHEREAS, the proposed clear cutting could pose a risk to residents of Bass River Township and property and will result in an unsightly general appearance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of
Bass River that the New Jersey Forest Fire Service is strongly urged to reject the proposed action to clear

cut trees near the Fire tower located at East Greenbush Road, in the Township of Bass River.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the New

Jersey Forest Fire Service for its records.
