Mr. Assur, Mr. Aaronson and Mr. Curtain asked for information on the proposed zoning ordinance changes. Solicitor noted the process was for introduction, distribution, hearings and subsequent adoption.

Brenda Percy asked why she was paying such high taxes on a property that is not worth it. She was advised to speak with Assessor. She would like to see more beatification in the Town.

Mrs. McCarten said the train park had a haunted Halloween ride and over 100 people came and loved it.

Carol Bitzberger thinks the Town should sue the State of NJ for the Pilot funds.

Mr. Aaronson requested further explanation on the \$350,000 debt. Al Stanley explained and said he would provide him with documents to better help with explanation.
