GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT FORM OF RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2019 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of <u>R.S.</u> 52:27BB-52, to wit:

<u>R.S.</u> 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Committee of the Township of Bass River, hereby states that it has complied with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

RESOLUTION 2020-54

AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH BURLINGTON COUNTY FOR CONTINUATION OF 911 COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

The motion was made by Mayor Cope, seconded by Commissioner Capriglione to approve Resolution 2020-54. Votes: Cope—Yes, Capriglione-Yes, Bourguignon-Yes. All in favor and Resolution 2020-54 was hereby approved.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Bass River recognizes the need to provide residents of the Township of Bass River with appropriate cost savings measures and opportunities for the benefit of all residents of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Bass River, Burlington County wishes to continue with "911" Communication Services through the Burlington County Department of Public Safety, Division of Central Communications, allow for routing of Central Communications and "911" calls through the Burlington County Department of Public Safety which services are paid for and administered by Burlington County; and

WHEREAS, the Board deems it advantageous to now memorialize the specific terms and conditions of such shared services agreement between Bass River Township and Burlington County; and

WHEREAS, Burlington County and the Township of Bass River would maintain the mutual responsibilities as detailed in the above-referenced Shared Services Agreement between the parties for the period of August 1, 2020 to July 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Board evidences its desire to enter into such Agreements through passage of this resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Entities will evidence their desire to enter into such Agreement through passage of an appropriate resolution or ordinance on or before commencement of the Shared Services Agreement with Burlington County and the Township of Bass River; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to participate as documented in the attached Shares Services Agreement between Burlington County and the Township of Bass River establishing the respective rights and obligations of the parties regarding this Shared Services Agreement; now, therefore,

RESOLVED, by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Burlington that:

- 1. The above-referenced Shared Services Agreement between Burlington County

 Department of Public Safety, Division of Central Communications and the Township of Bass River for utilization of the Burlington County Department of Public Safety, Division of Central Communications/911 call service shall be effective for the period of

 August 1,
 2020 through July 31, 2025.
- 2. The Bass River Township Clerk and Mayor are hereby authorized to sign, seal, execute and witness/attest the Agreement on behalf of the Township of Bass River of the County of Burlington in accordance with the Rules of the Board.
- 3. The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of five (5) years commencing
 August 1, 2020 and terminating July 31, 2025.
- 4. All terms, conditions, and responsibilities between the parties as detailed in the above-referenced Shared Services Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

- B. Curtain asked what the thoughts on the school would be and if the Township is interested in getting the building. Commissioner Capriglione said he wants to make sure the building is something that we wouldn't need to put a lot of tax payer money into.
- C. Bitzberger asked is the Township has increased the trailer fees for campgrounds. The Township has not increased the fees. She feels the Township should consider doing so.
- C. Bitzberger asked about plans for the school building. She believes it may be profitable to lease the space. However, how many businesses would be interested in this space. Commissioner Capriglione said the property could be leased as a school, medical facility of some sort of office space.
